

Imperfect Verb Personal Endings Handout

In the following chart, the three boxes represent the three root letters of any standard “strong” Hebrew verb. The Prefixes and Suffixes represent the doer of the imperfect verbal action. No matter which verb is being used, if you see these affixes, you can tell who the subject of the action is:

3ms = “he, it”	3mp = “they”
3fs = “she, it”	3fp = “they”
2ms = “you” (male)	2mp = “you (all)” (male/mixed)
2fs = “you” (female)	2fp = “you (all)” (female)
1cs = “I”	1cp = “we”

Below I provide the General Imperfect Prefixes and Suffixes (with prefix vowels and theme vowels omitted). These affixes are applicable to the imperfect forms in *all seven stems*, which is why the internal vowels are omitted.

1cs	אֶפְקֹד	1cp	נִפְקְדוּ
