## Ross Lesson 2 Hebrew Vowels with English Transliteration A Simplified Vowel Chart

Here is a chart with the vowels of Hebrew. Since vowels cannot exist alone, I am using the consonant  $\beth$  as an aid to pronunciation of the vowels, but note well that vowels can appear under any consonant. You need to be able to recognize the name of the vowel, its transliteration, its sound quality and length.
