Noun and Adjective Endings

Below is a chart containing the proper endings that we add to nouns and adjectives to mark whether the word is masculine singular, masculine plural, feminine singular, or feminine plural. Then we have the nouns oto (horse) and not (mare) with these endings. You need to be able to reproduce this chart, since the endings are applicable to a great many types of words: nouns, adjectives, and participles (which we'll meet later). Ø = zero/no ending.
